VERBAL TENSES

PRESENT SIMPLE

(Tu juegas al fútbol) You play football. She write<u>s</u> letters.

You <u>don't</u> play football. She <u>doesn't</u> write letters.

Do you play football? Does she write letters?

PAST SIMPLE

(Tu jugaste al fútbol) You play<u>ed</u> football. She <u>wrote</u> a letter.

You <u>didn't play</u> football. She <u>didn't write</u> a letter.

Did you play football? Did she write a letter?

<u>PRESENT PERFECT</u> (Tu has jugado al fútbol)

You <u>have played</u> football. She <u>has written</u> a letter.

You <u>haven't played</u> football. She <u>hasn't written</u> a letter.

<u>Have</u> you <u>played</u> football? <u>Has</u> she <u>written</u> a letter?

<u>PAST PERFECT</u> (Tu habías jugado al fútbol) You <u>had played</u> football. She <u>had written</u> a letter.

PRESENT CONTINUOUS

(Tu estás jugando al fútbol) You <u>are playing</u> football. She <u>is</u> writing a letter.

You <u>aren't playing</u> football. She <u>isn't writing</u> a letter.

<u>Are</u> you playing football? <u>Is</u> she writing a letter?

PAST CONTINUOUS (Tu estabas jugando al fútbol) You were playing football. She was writing a letter.

You <u>weren't playing</u> football. She <u>wasn't writing</u> a letter.

Were you playing football? Was she writing a letter?

<u>PRESENT PERFECT CONTINUOUS</u> (Tu has estado jugando al fútbol)

You <u>have been playing</u> football. She <u>has been writing</u> a letter.

You <u>haven't been playing</u> football. She <u>hasn't been writing</u> a letter.

Have you been playing football? Has she been writing a letter?

PAST PERFECT CONTINUOUS (Tu habías estado jugando al fútbol) You <u>had been playing</u> football. She <u>had been writing</u> a letter.

You <u>hadn't played</u> football. She <u>hadn't written</u> a letter.

Had you played football? Had she written a letter?

FUTURE (WILL)

(Tu jugarás al fútbol) You <u>will play</u> football. She will write a letter.

You <u>won't play</u> football. She <u>won't write</u> a letter.

Will you play football? Will she write a letter?

FUTURE PERFECT (Tu habrás jugado al fútbol) You <u>will have played</u> football. She <u>will have written</u> a letter.

You <u>won't have played</u> football. She <u>won't have written</u> a letter.

Will you have played football? Will she have written a letter?

FUTURE CONTINUOUS (Tu estarás jugando al fútbol) You <u>will be playing</u> football. She will be writing a letter.

You won't be playing football. She won't be writing a letter.

<u>Will</u> you <u>be playing</u> football? <u>Will</u> she <u>be writing</u> a letter?

CONDITIONAL (WOULD) (Tu jugarías al fútbol) You <u>would play</u> football. She <u>would write</u> a letter. You <u>wouldn't play</u> football. She <u>would't write</u> a letter.

You hadn't been playing football. She hadn't been writing a letter.

Had you been playing football? Had she been writing a letter?

FUTURE PERFECT CONTINUOUS (Tu habrás estado jugando al fútbol) You will have been playing football.

She <u>will have been writing</u> a letter.

You <u>won't have been playing</u> football. She <u>won't have been writing</u> a letter.

Will you have been playing football? Will she have been writing a letter?

FUTURE (GOING TO)

(Tu vas a jugar al fútbol) You <u>are going to play</u> football. She <u>is going to write</u> a letter.

You <u>aren't going to play</u> football. She <u>isn't going to write</u> a letter.

<u>Are you going to play football?</u> <u>Is she going to write</u> a letter?

FUTURE CONTINUOUS (GOING TO) (Tu vas a estar jugando al fútbol) You <u>are going to be playing</u> football. She <u>is going to be writing</u> a letter.

You <u>aren't going to be playing</u> football. She <u>isn't going to be writing</u> a letter.

<u>Are you going to be playing</u> football? <u>Is she going to be writing</u> a letter?

CONDITIONAL CONTINUOUS

(Tu estarías jugando al fútbol) You <u>would be playing</u> football. She <u>would be writing</u> a letter. You <u>wouldn't be playing</u> football. She <u>wouldn't be writing</u> a letter. Would you play football? Would she write a letter?

<u>CONDITIONAL PERFECT</u> (Tu habrías jugado al fútbol)

You <u>would have played</u> football. She <u>would have written</u> a letter.

You <u>wouldn't have played</u> football. She <u>wouldn't have written</u> a letter.

Would you have played football? Would she have written a letter? Would you <u>be playing</u> football? Would she <u>be writing</u> a letter?

<u>CONDITIONAL PERFECT CONTINUOUS</u> (Tu habrías estado jugando al fútbol) You <u>would have been playing</u> football. She <u>would have been writing</u> a letter.

You <u>wouldn't have been playing</u> football. She <u>wouldn't have been writing</u> a letter.
